at excessive speeds. At the Carnival last year we had a visit from John Morris from North Wales Police who gave us details of setting up our own **Community Speed Watch Scheme**, he took names but there were not enough people *then* to make the scheme viable.

With enough volunteers this scheme could still work – the Police supply all safety equipment, training and the initial loan of the speed camera. If we set up a successful scheme the Community Council will fund the purchase of our own equipment. To make this work we need sufficient volunteers and a coordinator, volunteers must be over 18 and the coordinator's role is vital to the running the group.
