The Crown Eisteddfod of the above village was held under the most favourable auspices, on Saturday last, in a capacious and specially erected marquee, close to the Gwydyr Hotel.

The weather was delightful, and attendance was good, there being a large influx of visitors from Blaenau Festiniog. The marquee had been tastefully decorated and the usual emblazonment of bardic names and Welsh mottoes adorned the stage and tent.

The musical adjudicator was Mr D Emlyn Evans, whose crisp and trenchant criticisms occasionally amused the audience to a high degree.

For the children's choir there were three entrants and the first to ascend the platform was our village choir. They started the test piece, 'Y Nant a'r Blodeuyn' well, but gradually went painfully out of tune. The palm was awarded to the children's choir of Trefriw for their singularly pretty rendition of the song.
