DOLWYDDELEN MAN WITHOUT A LICENCE

John Davies, Dolawel, Dolwyddelen, was charged by Mr. W H Darbyshire, Inland Revenue Officer with keeping a dog without a licence. The defendant said, that on the 11th June, he did not possess a dog; but that his wife had a dog, for which he produced a licence taken out later in June. P.C. Evans, Dolwyddelen, said he saw the dog on the defendant's premises on the date in question, and that the dog had been there some time. It was an old dog, and the defendant did not deny it belonged to him.

Ellis Jones, Garnedd, Roman Bridge, called by the defendant, said he sold the dog to Davies; but as the dog was in the habit of running home from everywhere, it was not actually 'bought' until the licence was taken out, and that he (the witness) had an exemption order and didn't need a licence.

The prosecutor remarked that it was indeed strange that the dog did not attempt to run away after the licence was taken out. The case was dismissed on payment of costs.
