### **SOUP KITCHEN**

The soup kitchen proposed by Baroness Willoughby D'Eresby, for the benefit of the poor of Dolwyddelen was established last week. A large number of gentlemen met together at the vicarage to plan and set the matter en-foot. The committee came to the decision that the most fit and proper place in which to make the soup would be, Bwlch Cynnyd, the home of Mr Daniel Williams, agent of the Prince Llewelyn Slate Quarry, his wife being a good hand at soup.

A cheque of £10 was received from Baroness Willoughby, with instruction more would follow. A letter was read stating that Her Ladyship congratulated those who were more fortunate, for assisting her in alleviating the suffering of the poverty stricken class in the parish. The first dole of soup was made on Saturday, about fifty had a share in it, and fifty sixpenny loaves were given away at the same time.

A collection is to be made next Sunday in Chapel and Church in aid of the movement.
