

MEMORIAL GARDENS

A new plaque commemorating a further three Dolwyddelan soldiers is now in place in the Memorial Gardens. These three brave men left their homes in the village and died as a direct result of fighting for their country. Sadly, due to dying after the official end of the wars they were not included on the War Memorial.

Douglas Graham McNaughton died in Dolwyddelan in 1922, from wound sustained whilst training at Kinmel Park Training Ground in 1916. He was 26 years old.

Albert Jones, after a long career in the Army was invalided out whilst serving in Egypt during WWI, he died in 1919 in Dolwyddelan, aged 30.



Arwen Morris Jones joined the army the second he was old enough in 1945. He was killed whilst driving an army lorry whilst on service in Germany in 1947. He was only 20 years old.
